Greetings:

At this time of year the air is filled with the scent of freshly mown hay, the tangy aroma of chopped silage, and the pleasant fragrance of a newly combined field. Harvest time in rural America is marked by busy, joy-filled days as grain is gathered into barns and fruits are gathered into jars.

As fall approaches, it's not only the harvest that is gathered. Students, teachers, and staff gather in classrooms as they return to share their gifts and questions and the joy of learning from one another. The call goes out welcoming children back to Sunday School. Confirmation classes invite new and returning students together for a time of faith formation and building relationships.
